

Getting Around Campus

BICYCLE OR CAR

- Prevent theft and be sure to Bug Your Bike. Info at: columbus.gov/bugyourbike
- Perform regular maintenance on your bike to keep it working properly
- Bring a bike lock to keep your bike secure
- Perform regular maintenance on your car to keep it running properly
- Purchase your on-campus parking permit at osu.campusparc.com

OFF-PEAK PARKING HOURS

To promote safety, some on-campus parking restrictions are reduced after 4 p.m. on weekdays, all day on weekends and on holidays to encourage customers to use the nearby parking lots. Check osu.campusparc.com for more info on these specific times.

CABS PARATRANSIT

- Door-to-door adaptive transportation whether you're on or off campus

How to Change a Car Tire



TOOLS NEEDED

- Car Jack
- Tire Iron



1. LOCATION

Find a safe place to pull over. Tools and spare tires are most often kept in the trunk under the carpet.



2. JACK POINTS

The four jacking points are located two to each side, outlined above.



3. LOOSEN BOLTS

Loosen by turning the iron counter clockwise, but do not fully remove.



4. RAISE CAR

Align the car jack under the car and twist to raise the car by turning clockwise.




5. REMOVE TIRE

Once the car tire is lifted, continue to unbolt the nuts and pull the tire off of its frame.



6. REPLACE TIRE

Put replacement tire on the car and secure with bolts to hold the tire in its place.



7. LOWER CAR

Lower the car jack slowly until the tire is safely back on the ground.



8. TIGHTEN

Tighten each of the bolts by turning the tire iron clockwise.

You're done!

Car Maintenance Checklist

REPLACE THE AIR FILTER

By replacing clogged air filters on older vehicles with carbureted engines, you can improve fuel economy and acceleration.

GET AN OIL CHANGE

This is one of the simplest services you can perform to improve your vehicle's fuel economy.

CHECK THE LIGHTS

Regularly check to make sure no headlights, turn signals or brake lights are out of order, and repair immediately if they are.

WASH YOUR VEHICLE

Keeps the paint and wax on the car.

CHECK YOUR TIRES

Regularly check tire pressure to stay safe and prevent a flat tire.
